



Garden Fence Makeover



ABOVE:
The boundary fencing hadn't been treated since erection. The natural timber colour had weathered & the panels covered in dirt & algae.



LEFT:
The dirt & algae were removed with a pressure washer stripping the timber back to a clean surface. Once fully dried, woodstains were applied for decorative colour and protection against the weather. The 1st coat of Wood Stain & Protector in Warm Stone soaked in beautifully leaving an instant block of colour.



LEFT:
The transformation is demonstrated well in this shot showing the transition from old dirty weathered boards, to pressure-washed panels, compared with fully decorated & treated sections of fencing.

RIGHT:
Mature rose bushes were covered for protection from thorns and the 1st coat left to dry before a final 2nd applied.



Posts and frames were painted with Royal Exterior in Hazelnut to contrast with the light colour of the wood stain on the panels, creating a dramatic background to planting.



ABOVE:
Now the fence panels were looking so good it was time for some hard digging before the fun planting could begin.
